A Message from Our Missionaries – Larry & Becky Stanton

Working in Greece last year, Larry met Petros Tsetris and Deena Stevens. This couple founded an NGO (non-governmental organization) called Yalla Help to support the refugees. Larry made them aware of the situation with the refugees in northern Serbia. They offered to come and buy supplies to donate and distribute. Last week Deena and Petros and two volunteers arrived in Serbia. Zoltán, the Baptist pastor, offered the team a place to stay at the church. They bought and distributed 500 pairs of gloves, 100 pairs of leggings and other supplies and distributed them to refugees along the Serbian border. Petros, Deena and their team discussed the possibility of buying food and firewood for the Serbian community. They put together a plan to organize and distribute commodities and a hygiene bag to 40 families in the villages near the Baptist church. Larry was amazed at their love for people--not just the refugees, but the poor in Serbia as well.

CALL FOR HELP IN BATON ROUGE, LA.

In October 2016, around 60,000 homes and businesses in Baton Rouge, LA were damaged by 2-4 feet of water in the structures. Twenty-four inches fell in less than 72 hours.



Three teams responded from our region; two teams in Nov. 2016 and one in January of this year.

Fifteen of our volunteers spent 15 days at six sites, giving 484 hours of labor. Jack Cobb, our national ABMen's disaster relief coordinator, extended the call and Vickie Goff, volunteer coordinator for American Baptist Home Mission Society,



indicated houses in various degrees of rebuilt help.

Members of the first team were Jack Cobb and Lucky Ray from West Virginia (green shirts), and Terry Maurizio, George Labadie and Richard Ruyle from our GRR Disaster Relief ministry. Other team members listed on the next page.

(Editor's note: The following was a letter Terry Maurizio sent to his team, requesting responses. It needs to be shared with all teams and all churches.)

"Pastor Joel Lohr (of Bethel Baptist Church, Jerseyville) spoke on 2 Thessalonians 3:6-18 Sunday and it moved me to want to lead a team to Baton Rouge. The title of his message was "Don't Just Sit There" and verse 13 was the key verse for me, "As for you brothers, do not grow weary in doing good." His 4 points about doing good work were as follows:

- God commands us to work (Exodus 20:8-9)
- God models work for us (Exodus 20:11)
- Work is part of the plan for creation (Psalms 104:23)
- Work is a gift from God (Colossians 3:17)

Pastor Lohr concluded by adding on to his title "Don't Just Sit There" ----- "Do Something!". Our final hymn Sunday was "I'll Go Where You Want Me To Go."
